«Jean Sibelius is one of those composers who express the character of the Finnish people by their music truthfully and effortlessly», wrote the critic K. Flodin about the remarkable Finnish composer in 1891. The creativity of Sibelius is not only a bright page in the history of the music culture of Finland, but his popularity as a composer has reached far beyond his native land. His most prosperous creative period was between the end of the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th century — a time of growing national liberation and revolutionary movements in Finland. At the time, the small state was a part of the Russian Empire and tested by the moods of an epoch of

social changes preceding a storm. It is remarkable that in Finland, as well as in Russia, this period created a significant rise in the growth of nationalistic art. Sibelius composed in various genres. He wrote seven symphonies, symphonic poems, three orchestral suites, a concert for a violin with an orchestra, two string quartets, piano quintets and trios, chamber vocal and instrumental works, music and drama performances, but his greatest talent lay in symphonic music. In Finland Sibelius played and plays an important role: he is recognized as the quintessential national composer, a symbol of greatness of the country. During his lifetime Sibelius received honours rendered to few artists. There are streets, parks and an annual music festival named after him, and the music institute he studied in was renamed as the Sibelius Academy. It is because of this that the City of Turku, which houses the Sibelius Museum, is a perfect place to organize this international competition of choruses, instrumental music and academic vocal.

Senior Choir of the Galina Vishnevskaya College

The Senior Choir of the Galina Vishnevskaya College of Music and Theater Arts was established in 2018. It consists of children of the choral department of the school, the age of participants is 11-16 years old. The head of the team and conductor is Diana Degtyareva, Laureate of International and All-Russian competitions, Honorary Worker of secondary vocational education in Russia. In its activities, the Senior Choir tries to preserve and multiply the traditions of academic choral singing, relying on classical Russian and foreign choral literature in the chosen repertoire, as well as folk songs, spiritual compositions, works by composers of the XX-XXI centuries are also present in the repertoire of the collective. The choir conducts active concert and competitive activities at leading venues in Moscow, participates in festivals of the «International Children's Philharmonic of Talents» of the «Art for All Time» Foundation, the children's creative project «Choral Youth of Russia», projects of the Vladimir Spivakov Charitable Foundation, conducts master classes on choral performance. In 2023, the Moscow Department of Culture awarded the collective the highest title "Moscow City Creative Collective" for merits and contribution to culture. The collective is a multiple winner of the first degree and the Grand Prix of numerous Russian and international competitions and festivals, conducts touring activities.

Tonal Children & Youth Choir

On July 2, 2019, accompanied by the Paytakht Orchestra and Tonal Choir, they had their first appearance at Vahdat Hall, performing Carmina Burana.


Tonal Children & Youth Choir has held several concerts along with the Tonal Choir. Among them, one can mention the concert on February 1, 2019, and two performances during the summer of 2022 at Roudaki Hall in Tehran. In the summer of 2023, Tonal Children & Youth Choir participated in the World Choir Games held in Gangneung, South Korea. They competed in the category of youth choirs in the open competition and achieved a score of 19.11, earning them a Silver Diploma. They also made history by becoming the first Iranian children and youth choir to participate in the World Choir Games.

Minsk, Belarus

The honoured group "Boys' and Youths' choir named after Igor Andreevich Zhuravlenko" works under the the state educational establishment "Republican Gymnasium-College at the Belarusian State Academy of Music".

The choir was founded in 1968 by a graduate of the Moscow State Conservatory. Igor Zhuravlenko – a student and continuer of the traditions of the A.V. Sveshnikov Moscow Choir college.

Since 2020, the group has been headed by a graduate of the choir – Siamion Klimanau (choirmaster – Volha Izhyk).

The complexity and diversity of the repertoire, as well as the accuracy and high level of performance are characteristic features of the choir, which is rightfully considered one of the oldest boys' choirs in the Republic of Belarus.

The choir also performed on concert tours in Europe (England, France, Holland, Belgium, Germany), and took part in international festivals in France, Italy, Switzerland, Latvia, Russia, China, Poland, Lithuania.

Over the years of the choir activity, its graduates have become outstanding choral and orchestral conductors, soloists of opera and drama theaters, teachers and music researchers.

Boys' and Youths' choir named after I.A.Zhuravlenko has a collection of prizes from European choir competitions: 1998 – 3rd International Robert Schumann Choir Competition (Germany) – "Golden Diploma" and a special prize for the best performance of romantic music; 1999 – F.Mendelssohn International choir competition (Germany) – Gold and Silver diplomas and a special prize of the German Singing Union; 2004 – Grand Prix of the 12th International Competition "Magutny Bozha" (Mogilev); Golden diploma, first place and Grand Prix of the Chancellor of Germany for the "Best Choir" at the "Harmonie-Festival" competition in Limburg (Germany) and others.

Under the leadership of Siamion Klimanau in December 2020, I.Zhuravlenko choir became the winner (Grand Prix holder) of the X International Competition "Winter's Tale" (St. Petersburg, Russia), in May 2021 the choir became a laureate of the first degree of the I International Choral Competition named after V. Rovdo (Minsk, Belarus). In April 2023, the choir won the Grand Prix of the V Minsk open competition of choral and solo singing "Vyasnovy speu" (Minsk, Belarus).

University of Puerto Rico at Ponce Concert Choir

The University of Puerto Rico in Ponce Concert Choir was founded by Prof. Rafael Montero Castro approximately in 1980. It operates as a creative space of excellence, where 40 students from different non music majors with economic needs come together to exploit their potential by creating good music. Year after year, they present a repertoire of excellence, that serves as refreshment and relaxation; both for the university community and for the public in general. The UPR Ponce Concert Choir has participated in "danza" festivals, concerts in museums and universities, international choral festivals and competitions. The choir has represented Puerto Rico in Venezuela, Vienna, Czech Republic, Rome Italy and United States (New York, New Jersey and Philadelphia).

The UPR Ponce Choir had the opportunity to publish a patriotic video during the pandemic which was last November 2020; "Preciosa" which served as an opportunity to reach millions of homes. Telemundo, Univision, Wapa, Channel 6, and countless influential people, artists, and public figures shared it. Undoubtedly, their hard work was compensated with cheers and recognition for the choir and the UPR Ponce.

Calmore Children & Youth Choir

Calmore Children and Youth Choir (CCYC) is an independent Children and Youth Choir from Bogor City, West Java. It was formed in mid-2022 by Fitri Intendia as Music Director and Conductor. Calmore comes from the combination of Italian "calma" which means calm and "amore" which means love. So the future hope is that all works from Calmore will make people feel calm, peaceful, and joyful. CCYC has been awarded the 1st Prize (gold medal) of Penabur International Choir Festival 2022 for virtual children choir category. CCYC also held its first concert in July 2023. In addition to participating in competitions, CCYC also actively creates projects and releases works in the form of virtual choirs to commemorate events such as Mother's Day.

Founded in 2009, the choir consists of Catholic youngsters performing a wide range of repertoire from classical, contemporary, and sacred scores to folk, secular, and popular music. Manado Catholic Choir aims to feature the best of choral artistry and provide its members the opportunity to develop their talents.

Since its foundation in 1899, Šibenik's Singing society "Kolo", has been preserving tradition of polyphonic singing, cherishes Croatian musical heritage and contributes to the affirmation of Croatian choral music, promoting it in Croatia and Europe. Numerous awards from singing competitions testify to the choir's success, and as a proof of successful work of "Kolo". The Charter of the Republic of Croatia stands out for special merits in promoting culture and contributing to cultural development in the Republic of Croatia and Europe. In its history, "Kolo" recorded 13 recordings, made over 1800 performances and concerts in 153 cities in Croatia and Europe, sang over 640 pieces and performed over 50 concert tours, 25 of which were foreign. ŠPD "Kolo" is the "pride of Šibenik", and the people of Šibenik consider it one of the most important symbols of the city.

Conductor: Chun-Chih Chen






