«Jean Sibelius is one of those composers who express the character of the Finnish people by their music truthfully and effortlessly», wrote the critic K. Flodin about the remarkable Finnish composer in 1891. The creativity of Sibelius is not only a bright page in the history of the music culture of Finland, but his popularity as a composer has reached far beyond his native land. His most prosperous creative period was between the end of the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th century —

a time of growing national liberation and revolutionary movements in Finland. At the time, the small state was a part of the Russian Empire and tested by the moods of an epoch of

social changes preceding a storm. It is remarkable that in Finland, as well as in Russia, this period created a significant rise in the growth of nationalistic art. Sibelius composed in various genres. He wrote seven symphonies, symphonic poems, three orchestral suites, a concert for a violin with an orchestra, two string quartets, piano quintets and trios, chamber vocal and instrumental works, music and drama performances, but his greatest talent lay in symphonic music. In Finland Sibelius played and plays an important role: he is recognized as the quintessential national composer, a symbol of greatness of the country. During his lifetime Sibelius received honours rendered to few artists. There are streets, parks and an annual music festival named after him, and the music institute he studied in was renamed as the Sibelius Academy. It is because of this that the City

of Turku, which houses the Sibelius Museum, is a perfect place to organize this international competition of choruses, instrumental music and academic vocal.

Vladimir Gurevich St. Petersburg, Russia Jury Chairperson

In 1971 he graduated from the Leningrad State Conservatory N. And. Rimsky-Korsakov (piano class of Professor. S. M. Chenevoy, class music theory of Professor Yu. N. Tyulin). In 1972 he defended his thesis, in 1990 - a doctoral. Professor (1993). Sphere of scientific interests - the history of Russian music, musical culture of the Central Asia, problems of contemporary music education. In 1969-76, he worked in Turkmenistan. From 1976 to 1999 he worked in Higher Trade-Union school of culture (Humanitarian University of trade unions), in 1999 - at the Academy of postgraduate pedagogical education, 2004 - in Russian pedagogical university A.I. Herzen. Invited Professor at the Institute of musicology at Leipzig University. The author of five monographs, more than four hundred articles in scientific journals of Russia and foreign countries. Specializes in the genres of piano ensemble and accompaniment. Deputy Chairman of the St. Petersburg Association of piano duets. Chairman of the organizing Committee of the competition «Brother and Sister», member of the jury at all-Russian competition of piano duets A. G. Bahchieva. The author of original compositions, arrangements and transcriptions for choir heard on the Philharmonic stages in different countries. One of the leaders of the Union of Composers of Russia, since 1994 - the Chairman of the audit Committee of the UK St. Petersburg, from 1995 to 2010 - Chairman of the audit Committee of the IC of Russia. At the tenth Congress of the Union of composers of Russia (2010) elected Secretary of this creative organization. Chairman of the Dissertation Council of the faculty of music, University A. I. Herzen. Honorary worker of higher professional education of Russia (2012).



Svetlana Stepanova Russia Jury Member



Svetlana Stepanova is a leader and organizer, teacher and musician in the field of higher professional education, who has many years of experience in training highly qualified personnel for Russian organizations and foreign countries working in the field of culture and art, a promising scientist. She has accumulated a huge work experience in educational and administrative work in higher education.

Svetlana has repeatedly been the organizer and moderator of round tables, scientific and practical seminars, All-Russian and internationally attended creative competitions and festivals, chairman and jury member of creative and performing sections in the field of musical art. Socially significant direction is fruitful work and performances in professional associations and public organizations that contribute to the development of the system of vocational education in Russia, in the field of international cooperation.

Scientific research, creative projects and educational and methodological developments of the author have been widely recognized, have practical value and published in a number of domestic and foreign publications. Svetlana has over 60 scientific and methodological, scientific works, publications, including: monograph, educational and teaching aids, scientific reports and articles that have received recognition in Russia, abroad (Germany, Canada). Her professional achievements in the fields of culture and education are marked by government and departmental awards.

Now he heads the Faculty of Music and Choreographic Art of the East Siberian State Institute of Culture, combining the position of dean with the head of the department, scientific, pedagogical and socio-professional activities, enjoys the authority and respect of the team and the professional community.

In 1994 she graduated from the piano department of the Irkutsk Regional Chopin College of Music. In 1998, she graduated with honors from the Music Faculty of Irkutsk State Pedagogical University. In 2006, she completed her postgraduate studies at Buryat State University with honors. Continuing to improve her professional skills, in 2010 Svetlana received an education at the Kazan State Conservatory named after N. Zhiganov in the specialty "Instrumental performance" (piano). In 2016, she entered and completed her doctoral studies in the field of "Theory and History of Culture" (Cultural Studies). He continues to improve his pedagogical skills, engage in scientific research, creative and methodical work.



Tatiana Chistyakova Russia Jury Member



Tatiana Chistyakova was born in Moscow in a family of musicians. She began to study piano at the age of six at the Children's Art School named after S. T. Richter (class teacher E. Chistyakova). Throughout her studies at the school, she regularly participated in concerts and competitions. The winners in the youth competitions "Hope" (1996), "Young Talents of Muscovy" (1998), the performance with the orchestra of a concert by I. S. Bach d-moll in the Great Hall of the Kaluga Philharmonic Hall, the first solo concert in two parts in Reutov became significant and participation in the Advendikontsert International Festival in Estonia. Since 2001, she studied at college, and then at the GMPI them. Ippolitova-Ivanova, who graduated with honors in 2011. All the years she studied in the class of professor, member of the Union of Composers of Moscow, laureate of international competitions Aida Petrovna Isakova. She continued her further education at the Incontri col maestro International Piano Academy (Imola, Italy), classes of professors V. Ashkenazi, A. Kravchenko, B.V. Petrushansky. Tatyana took part in master classes by such famous professors as V.K. Merzhanov, M.V. Filippov, V. Chuchkov, A. Kurtev, V.V. Mishchuk, R. Rizaliti, K. Pari, A. A. Pisarev, I. Glinka, D. Masleev. In the summer of 2004 she participated in master classes and concerts at the Margess International creative school in Switzerland. Tatiana Chistyakova is a laureate and diploma winner of more than twenty international competitions in Russia, Ukraine, Italy, Spain, Bulgaria, Serbia, and the USA. Among them: International Competition in Odessa (Grand Prix), «Musica classica» in Ruza, «Great Teachers» in Bulgaria, named after S. V. Rachmaninov in St. Petersburg, «Premio Pianistico Euterpe», «Pietro Argento», « Citta di Pesaro «,» Citta di Fasano «,» Anemos «,» Don Vincenzo Vitti «,» Paolo Serrao «,» Lia Tortora «,» Citta di Barletta «,» Citta di Caraglio «in Italy, Ibiza International Piano Competition, «Contemporary Art and Education», «Talents of the New Century» in Moscow, etc. Tatiana regularly gives solo concerts and in various compositions in the halls of Russia, Italy (including at the MiTo festival), Holland, Kazakhstan, Greece, and Bulgaria. She collaborated with orchestras under the direction of A. Vorontsov, I. Kazhdan, G. Aravidis, A. Khurgin, A. Istomin. Since 2011 - a participant in the programs of the St. Petersburg House of Music under the leadership of S.P. Roldugin. Since 2014, collaborates with the concert agency Classics Concert. Since 2015, regularly takes part in the jury of various competitions, such as the European competition «Don Matteo Colucci», (Fasano, Italy)., International Piano Competition. Aida Isakova (Aiz Almaty, Kazakhstan), the Internet contest «Music Prospect», «Mediterraneo competition» (Bari, Italy), the Art Academy (Kyrgyzstan), the 1st All-Russian Piano Competition «MariaFest» and others. Conducts master classes in Russia and Italy. Since 2017, she is the art director of the Artist creative association. Since 2018 - Member of the World Piano Teachers Association. In November 2018, she performed at Carnegie Hall (New York, USA) Has recordings on the radio «Orpheus», «Russian World». In 2015, a CD was released recording the popular works of P.I. Tchaikovsky in transcription for piano by A. Isakova.



Maria Krasnova Russia Jury Member



As a concert pianist, Maria Krasnova has given solo recitals around Russia and Europe. Her repertoire includes masterpieces such as late Beethoven's Sonatas (op. 110-111), Chopin's Scherzos, Etudes and Nocturnes and the most virtuosic pieces of piano repertoire such as Pictures at an Exhibition by Mussorgsky, Petrushka by Stravinsky, and Ravel's Gaspard de la Nuit. In few past seasons Maria has collaborated with the Ural State Philharmonic Orchestra performing with them Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 23, Liszt's piano Concerto No. 1, Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto No. 1 in B-flat minor, Op. 23, Prokofiev's Piano Concertos No. 1, Op. 10 and No. 3, Op. 26. Mrs. Krasnova has also appeared as a soloist with the Moscow Philharmonic Orchestra and Evgeny Svetlanov's State Academic Symphony Orchestra performing Piano Concertos by Grieg and Schumann.

Mrs. Krasnova has achieved the International recognition of her performing skills winning at International Piano Competition in Astana, Kazakhstan (Grand Prix, 2003), International Competition "Russian Season in Yekaterinburg", Russia (Grand Prix, 2005), International Piano Competition in Andorra, Italy (Special Prize, 2006), International piano Competition in Ufa, Russia (Third Prize, 2011), Vera Lotar-Schevchenko International Competition in Yekaterinburg, Russia (Fourth Prize, 2012).

Maria has received her advanced degrees in piano performance and pedagogy from the Ural State Conservatory and currently holds a faculty position at the same conservatory.



Elena Sharova Russia Jury Member



Sharova Elena is a pianist, a full-time teacher of special piano at the Children's Art School named after E. A. Mravinsky in St. Petersburg.

A graduate of the Gorky Conservatory named after M. I. Glinka in the piano class.

She conducts active competitive, concert, educational and methodological activities, she has students who are laureates, including winners of the Grand Prix, International and national competitions.



Darinka Todorov Serbia Jury Member

I work as a pianist, professor, accompanist and chamber musician, performing mostly classical music. As a piano professor I work almost 37 years at music school "Stanislav Binički" - Belgrade. During a long career, as chamber musician, I cooperated with musicians from Sweden, Finland, Serbia etc. On International piano competition in Novi Sad (Serbia), and other domestic competitions I was a jury member. In National theatre - Belgrade I was working on opera "Salome" and cooperating with German conductor Johanes Harneit. For about 15 years, Svetozar Vujic - double bass, and I perform and play together, as a chamber duo "DiS". Among other concerts, we had recitals in Belgrade -Serbia, on BASS CONGRES 2016. - PRAGUE, BASS CONGRES 2018. - LUCCA - ITALY, at ISB Convention 2019. -Bloomington - USA. Our most recent concert was at 10.03.2021. - Historical musem - Belgrade - online streaming.



Desislava Bobrina Bulgaria / Russia **Jury Member**

Born in Bulgaria, Desislava Bobrina began studying piano at the age of 7 at music school in Moscow. Since 2003 she continued her education at the Central Music school of the Moscow State Conservatory with M.A Marchenko Since 2006 she studied in Moscow State Conservatory in the class of professor Yury Airapetyan.

From 2011-2014 Desislava studied postgraduate performance course in Moscow State Conservatory and in "Alfred Schnittke Akademie International" in Hamburg (2011-2012) with professor Brenno Ambrosini.

Desislava gives concerts in concert halls of Moscow, other Russian cities and abroad (Bulgaria, Belarus, Armenia, Italy, Spain, Croatia, Germany).

She regularly gives solo concerts, participates in the concerts "Music in the palace", "Sofia music weeks" (Sofia, Bulgaria), Festival in Besalu (Spain), Piano Loop (Croatia). Desislava regularly performs with orchestra in Great Hall of Moscow State Conservatory and orchestras in many cities. She has CD records, made by Conservatory, records on National Bulgarian radio and on television.

She is laureate of different competitions, such as:

- International Chopin competition in Varna(Bulgaria,4 prize) in 2005,

Desislava also performs as part of piano duo with her sister Maria Bobrina.



Yuki Negishi Japan / Great Britain Jury Member

Yuki Negishi has established herself as a pianist of rare poetry, passion and virtuosity, as well as an adjudicator, educator and researcher, captivating audiences wherever she performs around the world. Yuki has already performed in over 500 concerts in the UK alone, and regularly performs about 30 concerts a year as recitalist, concerto soloist and chamber musician in countries such as the Netherlands (Concertgebouw), France, Germany, Switzerland (Zurich Tonhalle), Italy (Festival di Londra, Blanc European Festival), Romania, Japan, China and the USA.

She has been broadcast on BBC Radio 3, ITV, Channel 4, Dutch, Polish, Romanian and French television and radio. She will be releasing her second CD through the Quartz label (www.quartzmusic.com) in 2022, including music by Chopin and Kapustin. During the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic, she performed for various online festivals, including the Absolute Classics Festival Live Rooms Online (which reached over 100K views and featured on ITV News). Her "Piano Music by Women" series in June/July 2020 was chosen in the TOP 5 online performances for the week of 29 June 2020 alongside the Wigmore recitals by Angela Hewitt and Mitsuko Uchida/Mark Padmore by PIANIST Magazine.

She also served as a jury member for the Sussex International Piano Competition consecutively four times since its inauguration in 2010 (including the recent 2018 edition), the Open Piano Competition (2012), the London Youth Piano Competition (2019, 2021), Music and Stars Awards (2020, 2021), the Artepiano International E-Competition (2020) and 10 online competitions during the COVID-19 pandemic as part of the International Competition of Music and Arts (2021). She will be on the jury of the Indonesia International Youth Music Olympics in April 2022, and the Jean Sibelius International Instrumental Music Competition in Finland in Nov 2022 (online).



Olga Ushakova Russia Jury Member

Olga Ushakova (1948), Assistant Professor at Lomonosov Moscow State University (MSU), Faculty of Art. She graduated from Russian Gnesin's Academy of Music, Russian State Social University, and works as a piano professor. Olga Ushakova supervises and coordinates creative work of piano and chamber ensemble at the Institute of Contemporary Art in Moscow.

Olga Ushakova regularly participates in a wide range of concerts, in particular, as a concertmaster accompanying both vocalist and instrumental groups, as a part of Violin Ensemble of Siberia and the soloists' ensemble "Concertino" at Moscow State Philharmonic. For many years she was the first performer that played Russian composers' works at the "Moscow Autumn" Festival and one of the organizers of the International Festival-Competition "Music of Childhood" in Moscow.

Olga Ushakova's students and graduates constantly participate in city conferences, international scientific and practical conferences, festivals, and competitions. She has trained more than 40 laureates (including Grand Prix Laureates) in various musical competitions in Russia, Greece, China, and Finland. Olga Ushakova has been decorated with the Badge of Honour of the Ministry Education and Science and in 2014 was enlisted in digital catalogue "Top 100 Russian lecturers at the year of 2014". She is a laureate of both international (Greece, China) and Moscow musical competitions; Olga Ushakova was awarded multiple diplomas, certificates of merit, and letters of gratitude from the Moscow goverment. The main purpose of Olga Ushakova's teaching activity is the development and full realization of creative potential of each student.



Cheng-Yu Wu Taiwan Jury Member



Cheng-Yu Wu was born in Taichung, Taiwan in 1981. He began his musical education at the National First Senior High School of Taichung under Ms. Li-Ming Chen's guidance in 1996. He attended National Taiwan University and majored in Philosophy in 1999. Meanwhile, he continued to pursue music career and studied with Mr. Anders Norell and Ms. Yi-Hui Lin. Cheng-Yu was the First Chair flute in the Ministry of National Defense Symphony Orchestra between 2003 and 2004 during the military service. In 2005, Cheng-Yu went to Europe and studied music under Harrie Starreveld, Marten Root, Marieke Schneemann, and Ellen Vergunst at Conservatorium van Amsterdam. In 2011, Cheng-Yu earned his Master's Degree in Music from Conservatorium van Amsterdam.

Cheng-Yu is known as a flutist and specialized in interpreting variety of music styles. He studied contemporary music with Mr. Harrie Starreveld, and Baroque flute with Mr. Marten Root. He formed his chamber music group, The CVA Trio, with Violist Mr. Victor Gil Gazapo and Harpist Ms. Anna Steinkogler in 2009 and performed in both the Netherlands and Austria. During this time, Cheng-Yu also collaborated with Pianist Harimada Kusuma as Goudsbloemduo in 2008. They have been performing in the Netherlands, Belgium, Italy, and Taiwan till today.

In 2012, Cheng-Yu started an experimental solo flute recital project titled "Just Flute?!". The project was well received and soon he was invited to feature in the Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam, and Taipei International New Music Festival. Cheng-Yu is well-known for his creativity of playing different types of flutes for various music styles. In additional to concert performance, Cheng-Yu is dedicated to flute and composition education. He formed a modern music ensemble, TimeArt Studio, in 2013. Cheng-Yu's first flute solo album Ten Poems was released in 2014 and was nominated for The Golden Melody Awards for Traditional Arts and Music in Taiwan. His second album Parallaxis was released in May 2018. Cheng-Yu is currently active as a flute soloist and a music educator in Shanghai and various cities in Taiwan.



Amelia obtained her Bachelor and Master degree in Classical Music Performance at The Royal Conservatory of Music in Ghent, Belgium; under the guidance of Alessandro Moccia, Mikhail Kugel, Mikhail Bezverkhny, and Liliya Umnova.

During her stay in Europe 2008-2014, she was a member of some orchestras in Belgium and France, such as Brussels Philharmonic Orchestra, Les Symphonistes Europèens, Koninklijk Lyrisch Toneel Kortrijk, Het Vlaams-Brabant Orchestra, Alden Biesen Zomeropera, and orchestra projects from Conservatorium Gent, Tilburg, and Maastricht with the conductors such as Dirk Brosse, Arjan Tien, and Michael Tabachnik. She also had performed in festivals such as Crescendo Summer Institute (Hungary) and Oberstdorf Musiksommer (Germany), and had masterclasses with Tanja Becker-Bender, Uwe Steinmeitz, David Danel, Dag Erik Anderson, and Shirly Laub; as well as for chamber music with Doric Quartet and Minguett Quartet. In 2010-2015, she taught violin at Jeugd en Muziek Brussel, Belgium. In 2007, Amelia won the 1st prize of Dr. Johannes Oentoro Violin Competition at Universitas Pelita Harapan, Indonesia. Before her departure to Europe for further study, she was a member of many orchestra in Jakarta, and in 2008 she was chosen to play with The Tokyo City Philharmonic Orchestra.

Since her return in 2014, Ms. Tionanda is the concertmistress of Nusantara Symphony Orchestra, assistant concertmaster of Bandung Philharmonic, and an active member of Jakarta Sinfonietta, Jakarta Concert Orchestra, and Jakarta Symfonia Orchestra.

She is regularly giving masterclasses, orchestra and chamber music workshop, and violin jury in various violin competitions and festivals in Indonesia.

Ms. Tionanda is currently working at at The Music Conservatory of Pelita Harapan University as violin lecturer and Head of String Department, and at the Gloriamus Music School as Head of String Department and violin teacher.

Her violin students are winners of several prestigious violin competitions in Indonesia, such as Semarang Violin Competition, Gloriamus Violin Competition, IYMO, PPC Bandung, etc.



Chaerin Kim USA Jury Member



A multi-instrumentalist, being one of the very few in the world who you can see performing as a soloist with two instruments on the same stage with an orchestra, internationally acclaimed harpist, pianist, composer, and professor Dr. Chaerin Kim is the winner of several international competitions. She was the winner of the Special Prize of Best Performance of Russian Music at the International Harp Competition in Russia, winner of the Future Classic Women Award from the London Radio Station, the CFA Award and Department Honor Award from Boston University, the Garrett Award, Foundation Award, and Julia Leney Harp Prize in London, the Soloist Competition Winner at Ewha University, Kaywon School for the Arts, and Boston University, the Bronze Medalist for Solo Piano at the Walgan Music Competition, and winner of the Grand Prize from the Korean Student's Newspaper.

Her harp performance has been used for the British movie Kaleidoscope (Main actor Toby Jones), which was the winner of Best Performance at the Edinburgh International Film Festival. As a composer, her composition, Rendezvous, has 100 versions, including versions for orchestra, harp, piano, and voice, with lyrics written by her and translated into 80 different languages, and the orchestral version of Rendezvous had its world premiere in Boston, Massachusetts. She released 146 songs (7 Albums and 91 Singles), and many of her music was aired on the radio stations in U.S., and UK. Most recently, she was nominated for and awarded the Future Classic Women Awards through the London Radio Station, who interviewed her twice, and also interviewed with WCPE Radio in USA.

Dr. Kim's musical studies began when she was six years old. She majored in piano at the Yewon Music Middle School, while also beginning studies in cello and voice. After Yewon, she went on to attend Kaywon High School of Arts, where she continued to major in piano. In her last year, at the age of eighteen, she also started lessons on harp, and six months later won the Soloist Audition for Harp. She received her B.A. with Highest Honors from Ewha University in Seoul – then, while pursuing her master's degree at Ewha, she was offered a scholarship for a PGD at the Royal Academy of Music in London, where she graduated with "distinction." She got her M.M. from Yale University on a scholarship, graduating summa cum laude. She was invited to the Artist's Diploma program at Yale and Graduate Diploma Program at New England Conservatory – however, she decided to pursue her doctorate at Boston University, where she was offered a full scholarship. She was the "quickest recipient of a Doctorate" in BU Music School's history, completing it in three and a half years.

As a contest judge and jury, Dr. Kim was the artistic director of the USA International Music Competition in 2010, and in 2021, she is judging at 10 international competitions for both harp and piano: the Music International Grand Prix in New York, the King's Peak International Music Competition in California, the World Vision Music Contest in Germany, the Grand Metropolitan International Music Competition in Canada, the International Music Competition in Serbia, Music Modern in Ukraine, Musical South Palmyra in Ukraine, the International Youth Music Competition in Finland. Dr. Kim was formerly a professor at Eastern Nazarene College, where she taught harp, piano, music theory and music history classes, and was also the former Head of the Harp Department at Adagio Music Academy and South Shore Conservatory. Currently, she is an artistic director of UIMC, an artist with the TTF Entertainment company in China, and a professor of both instruments; harp and piano at University of Massachusetts Boston, Schloss Akademie in Germany, and harp through the Office of Arts at Harvard University.






Michel Plasson - "Daniela is an extraordinary harpist with a highly consolidated technique and enchanting musicality." Daniela was born in Sofia, Bulgaria. At the age of 9, she started to study the piano and five years later, commenced her harp studies in the L. Pipkov Musical Institute with Constance Karadjova. In 1980, she received the harp position in the Bulgarian PIONER Youth Philharmonic Orchestra. In 1984, Daniela commenced her studies in the Sofia National Conservatoire. A year later, she won a scholarship to study at the Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov Conservatoire in St. Petersburg, where, in 1990 and under the direction of the renowned harpist Tatiana Tauer, she obtained a PhD in Harp studies (as the first study instrument) and a further PhD in Piano studies (as a second study instrument), graduating with first-class honours (Summa Cum Laude). The following prizes Daniela has won are worth noting: Silver medal in the 7th Bulgarian National Harp Competition (1985), where she also received the Special Prize for the Youngest Participant; she was a prize winner in the International Festivals in Moscow and St. Petersburg (1988); the Andrés Segovia and José Miguel Ruiz Morales prize as the most distinguished student in the Música en Compostela competition, awarded by the prestigious harpist Nicanor Zabaleta; the Jakez François 1st prize in the 1st Iberian Chamber Music with Harp Competition in Madrid (2004), with violinist Sergei Teslia. In 1991, Daniela received the harp soloist position in the Royal Seville Symphony Orchestra. Since 2002, she has been the harp tutor at the Special School for Music at San Francisco de Paula School in Seville. She also gives master classes sponsored by grants awarded by the Junta de Andalucía (the Andalusian regional government) and the Asociación Amigos de la ROSS (the Royal Seville Symphony Orchestra Fellowship). In 2017, she was named as the tenured harp lecturer for the Master's degree in Soloist Performance, speciality: Harp Studies at the KATARINA GURSKA Centre for Higher Musical Education, Madrid.

Since 2002, Daniela has led an intensely active career as a soloist and also in chamber music duos with María Antonia Rodríguez, flute soloist in the RTVE Symphony Orchestra. In 2004, in conjunction with Don José Enrique Ayarra, Seville Cathedral's principal organist, Daniela performed a concert of 19th and 20th century music with an electroacoustic harp in the aforementioned cathedral. This repertoire had never before been performed with this type of harp. For the occasion, the instrument was loaned by the Victor Salvi Foundation. Composers such as Antonio Noguera, Esteban Sanz Vélez, Julio Lozano, Martín Zalba, Luis Ignacio Marín and Gualberto García have dedicated works to her.

Daniela has recorded with many different record labels for Bulgarian, Russian, Spanish and Italian national radio and television broadcasters. She frequently performs in recitals, chamber ensembles in Europe, the USA, Russia and Asia. Furthermore, she performs with highly prestigious orchestras such as the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra (London), the Symphony Orchestra of the Mariinsky Theatre, the State Orchestra of St. Petersburg, the Symphony Orchestra of India, the Gürzenich Orchester Köln and the Sofia Philharmonic Orchestra, the Royal Symphony Orchestra of Seville, working with conductors such as Maazel, Muti, Jansons, Lazarev, Rostropovich, Plasson, etc. In addition, Daniela frequently performs at festivals, for instance: the Santander International Festival, International Harp Festival "Northern Lyre", Mariinsky Theatre, the Festival of Granada, Clásicos en Verano and the Festival Dei Due Mondi – Spoleto...


Yihe Zhang Shenzhen, China

Tangerang, Indonesia






